

13. All players are expected to play in the spirit of the game by:

- Acting with integrity – for example, by following the Rules of Golf, applying all penalties, and being honest in all aspects of play.
- Showing consideration of others – for example by playing at a prompt pace, looking out for the safety of others, and not distracting the play of another player.
- Taking good care of the course – for example, by replacing divots, smoothing bunkers, repairing ball marks, and not causing unnecessary damage to the golf course.
- Players are expected to recognize when they have breached the Rules of Golf and to be honest in applying their own penalty.

Frequency of the infraction needs to be taken into consideration. Infractions should be reported to the tournament chair following the round. A written complaint must be submitted to the ILGA President within 7 days of the infraction. The President will call an emergency meeting of ILGA elected officials within 10 days of receiving the notification.

Since severity and frequency of violations can vary greatly, corrective action should be consistent with the level and severity of the violation. Corrective action can include, but are not limited to, the following.

- Mitigation to address issue; i.e. counting beads, etc.
- Agreement by violator to cease the violation; i.e. language, interruptions during a swing, damaging the course, etc.
- Disqualification of game day play
- Suspension of golfing privilege for specific time period.

It is in the best interest of the game that the above actions are followed.
